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#### Introduction

- Understanding patient satisfaction in the NICU requires an investigation into parent satisfaction.
- Parents are a vital component of the family-centered care (FCC) model.
- FCC is a shared approach to the planning, delivery, and evaluation of the plan of care that fosters a partnership between the healthcare team, patients, and their families.
- The core principles of FCC are respect, information and education, coordination of care, physical support, emotional support, and involvement of parents

#### **Methods**

The Empowerment of PArents in The Intensive Care (EMPATHIC-30-NICU-USA) is linguistically adapted in English & Spanish and is comprised of 5 domains: information, care & treatment, organization, parental participation, & professional attitude that can be used to objectively query parents.



A total of 50 parents completed the 30 question survey at time of discharge and after discharge using an electronic form. We identified that parents were less satisfied in information domain with particular agreement in 2 of the survey questions.
